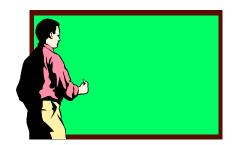


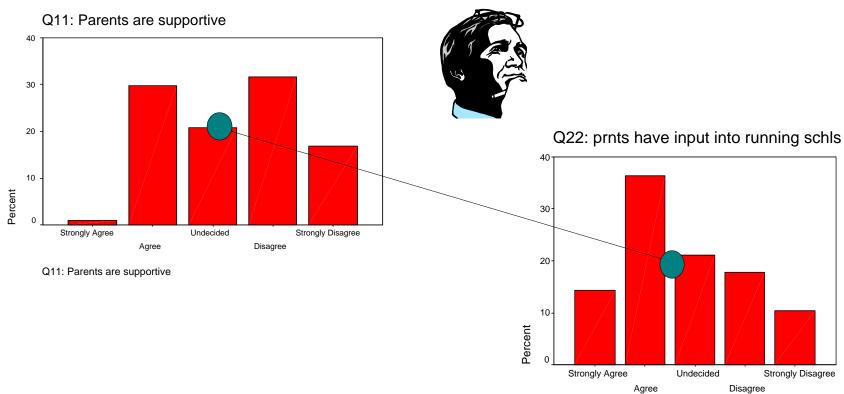

What can the additional stakeholders improve upon in this area?

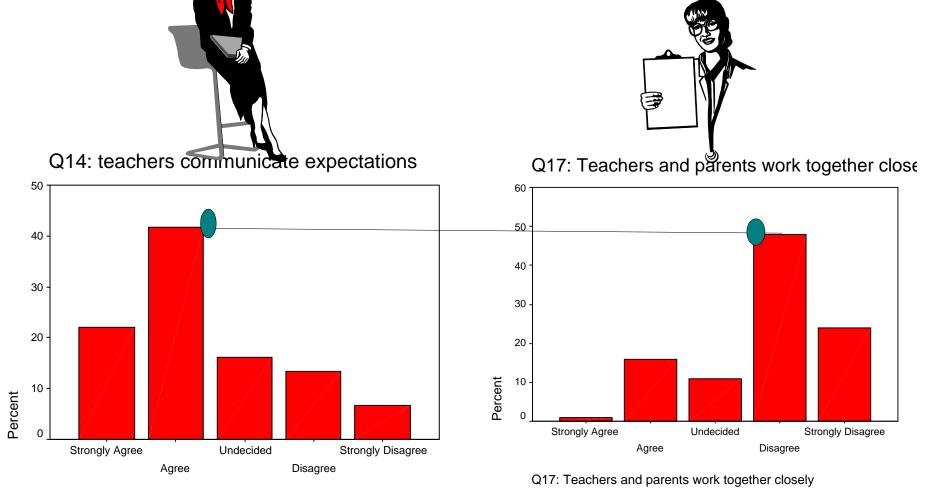

In this area a contradiction exists. How can teachers communicate effectively if they disagree about working closely together with parents. These responses are not aligned. Again, what can be done to improve communication?

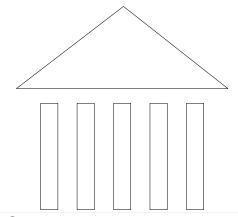

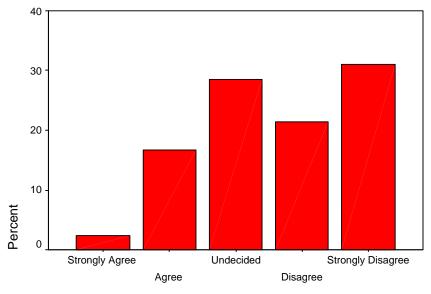

### In this area, a significant

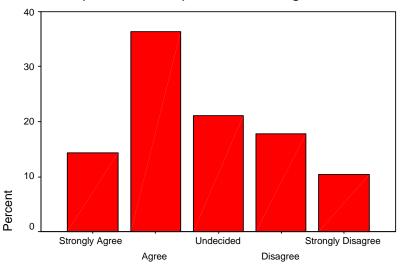

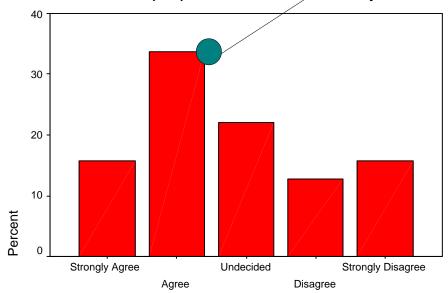

Students believe they are prepared, although the parents and community disagree. What are the motives behind the student responses, and why does a contradiction exist in this area?

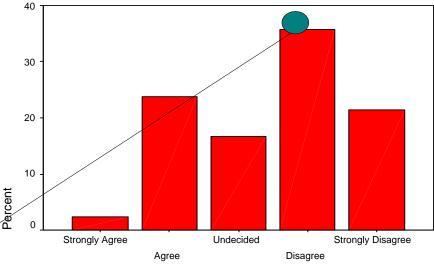

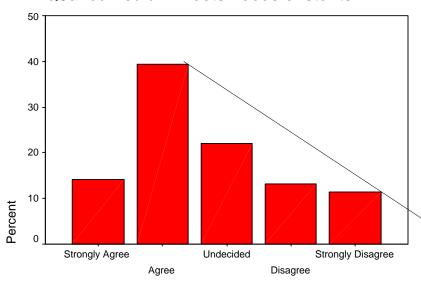

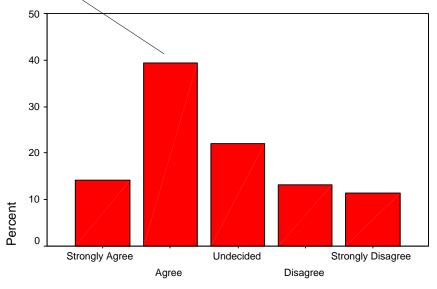
Q9a: curriculum meets needs of stdnts
