EDU 7801 – Digital Portfolio Professor Jonathan Hughes

In this course we were introduced to the World Wide Web and the part it will play in our studies. During our studies Professor Hughes guided us to the mechanics of setting up a web site. He demonstrated different ways to do this and then had each of us to practice. This course covered the components of a digital portfolio and exactly how we should construct one. - understand the broad perspective that integrates and applies the contributions of research experience with leadership through a portfolio.
- apply theory, always illustrated by concrete examples, to be used as tools for solving real problems through the development of a portfolio.
- present case problems and illustrations from actual leadership experiences using a digital portfolio.
- identify the complexities and ambiguities of research and its application to the field within a portfolio.
- provide a systems approach, which recognizes that there are no neat research answers to the array of organizational complexities facing leaders using a professional portfolio.
